SAFARI STYLE: CAMPING

Overnight 11 nights on safari designated campsites, in national parks and towns. Campsites have hot showers. Please note there is 1 night of wild camping when canoeing on the lower Zambezi without fences in the wilderness. In the middle of the trip there are 2 nights at a lodge in Nyanga with en-suite rooms.

Meals 14 breakfasts, 12 lunches and 11 dinners will be provided by the Sunway crew, prepared at the vehicle and eaten around the camp fire or in the boma. 3 dinners will be own expense meals in local restaurants.

Transport Due to sometimes poor roads we only use Sunway Safari trucks for this tour. Potholes, damaged gravel roads and livestock on the roads can make travel slow, you'll pass through villages and witness the local lifestyle all the way. For the game drives in Hwange National Park we use open 4WD.

Limited participation An essential part of your safari is participation. From putting up your tent to packing the truck in the morning – it's all part of your adventure. Your tour leaders will do all the meal preparation but we do ask the clients to help (on rotation) with the washing up. There are some long travel days which means early morning starts so we all need to get involved to make the day run efficiently.



Day 1 LIVINGSTONE/ VICTORIA FALLS [camping - - -]

Our journey begins with the incredible views as the mighty Zambezi River plunges 110 meters over the Victoria Falls. We spend the afternoon exploring the mile wide waterfall and the surrounding rainforest that is created by the spray. We settle into camp in the late afternoon with the guides briefing before having dinner (own expense) at a local restaurant. Optional activity of a flight over the falls or a sunset river cruise may be possible (own expense).

Day 2 KAFUE RIVER [camping BLD]

We pack up camp and depart Livingstone for the long drive across southern Zambia to our camp on the Kafue River. We pass small villages, and the rolling landscape offers interesting views before we drop down into the lower Zambezi River valley. We spend the late afternoon in preparation for our canoeing expedition down the lower Zambezi River.

Distance/time: ±510km, 8h00 actual driving time, a long driving day along very scenic but bumpy roads, with stops for sightseeing and lunch, we expect a travel day of ±10h00.

Overnight: Campsite – good ablution facilities, hot showers, swimming pool & bar.



Day 3 - 4 LOWER ZAMBEZI CANOEING [camping BLD]

True adventure begins. This morning we pack our canoes and head out onto the Zambezi River. Home of the tribal mythical god Nyami Nyami. The River is lined with small villages and diverse scenery. For the entire day birdwatching and photographic opportunities abound. We paddle with the river current and take time to enjoy the calm and serenity, new views are offered as the river snakes its way through the valley, and the sound of the African fish eagle can be heard as it calls from the tree tops. We stop for a rest and lunch on the banks of the river before heading out again for the afternoon.

Our camp is wild on the riverbank in the heart of untamed Africa. The following morning we canoe further downstream into a wildlife rich area with opportunities of seeing hippos, elephants and other wildlife. Before we are collected by motorboat and make our way back to the starting campsite.

Includes: 1½ day canoe safari on Lower Zambezi with local river guide.

Distance/time: N/A

Overnight: Camping – on day 3, we camp wild on the banks of the Zambezi River, on day 4, we stay in a designated campsite, with good ablution facilities, with hot showers, swimming pool & bar. You will need to bring your own towel.



Gwabi River Lodge is owner-managed and 100% of their staff are Zambian. The lodge produces "eco-charcoal" in the Lower Zambezi Valley which reduces tree-felling by the local community for cooking firewood. They assist the local school with vegetable seeds, help with the water pumps, fuel for transport and advice when needed for the vegetable cultivation.



Day 5 **CHINHOYI** [camping BL-]

We cross into Zimbabwe at the Chirundu border post and traverse the Hurungwe Safari area to our next stop at Chinhoyi Caves. Crystal clear, cobalt blue water lies at the bottom of the "pool of the fallen". The extensive system of caves and tunnels were used as a place of safety for Mashona tribesman against the Matabele raiders.

Day 5: Dinner will be an own expense meal at a local restaurant

Includes: Entrance fee to the caves

Distance/time: 250km, 3h30 actual driving time. Stops for border crossing, lunch and scenery, we expect a travel day of $\pm 6h30$.

Overnight: Campsite – good ablution facilities, hot showers.

Day 6 - 7 **NYANGA NATIONAL PARK** [lodge BLD]

We spend two days exploring Nyanga Mountain National Park. The park offers breathtaking vistas and diverse landscapes with Mount Nyangani, Zimbabwe's highest point at 2592m above sea level. As we explore its trails, you'll encounter lush forests, cascading waterfalls, and serene lakes. The air is crisp, and the sounds of nature surround us, creating a peaceful atmosphere.

The variety of ecosystems and climate in the area make it a birders haven. Interesting birdlife includes the Blue Swallows in summer and Wattled Cranes breed in the area during the winter months, and a variety of raptors.

Day 6, 7: Breakfast provided by the tour leaders with the help of the group

Includes: Entrance to Nyanga National Park

Distance/time: 390km, 6h00 actual driving time. With stops for lunch and scenery we expect a travel day of $\pm 7h00$.

Overnight: [Nyanga Pine Tree Inn](#) – twin en-suite, hot showers, bar & restaurant. Wifi available in main area only.



Pine Tree Inn Nyanga is an owner-managed country inn that primarily employs staff from the local community and actively supports various community initiatives. Its current project is the renovation of the maternity ward at the local district hospital. The inn grows its own vegetables and sources most of its consumables from local producers and traders.





Day 8 - 9 **CHIMANIMANI NATIONAL PARK** [camping BLD]

In the morning we make our way to Chimanimani National Park, where we make camp for the next two nights. The scent of wildflowers fills the air as you explore the winding trails, immersing yourself in nature's beauty.

On day 9, we visit the Bridal Veil Falls and for the more adventurous we embark on a walk up Pork Pie Hill in Chimanimani National Park. The park offers breathtaking landscapes and abundant birdlife. The Afro-Montane forests are home to 74 species of endemic birds, eland, bushbuck and blue duiker.

Distance/time: ±260km, 4h00 actual driving time with stops for scenery we expect a travel day of ±5h00.
Overnight: Campsite – good ablution facilities with hot showers.



Day 10 **GREAT ZIMBABWE MONUMENTS** [camping BL -]

Dating back to the 11th century, Great Zimbabwe was the capital of the Kingdom of Zimbabwe. These are some of the oldest stone structures in Southern Africa. The remnants of a civilization of up to 20,000 people surviving on trade in gold, cattle and crops. The word Zimbabwe means "houses of stone". The complex drystone walls and ruins leave archaeological clues as to the lifestyle of the people of the area. We explore this national monument and UNESCO World Heritage Site on foot with a guided walk through the hill complex and valley ruins.

Includes: Entrance and guided tour of the Zimbabwe Ruins.
Distance/time: ±305km, 4h00 actual driving time. Rolling hills, a few roadblocks and a lunch stop should mean a travel day of ±5h30
Overnight: Campsite – basic ablution facilities with showers, restaurant & bar.



Day 11 - 12 **MATOPOS** [camping BLD]

Bulawayo is our next destination and the Matopos National Park. Arriving in the late afternoon, we set up camp on the outskirts of the park. We spend the following day exploring the park.

Matobos National Parks' giant granite boulder landscapes, ancient rock art and surrounding wildlife make this a highlight of the tour. We embark on an open game drive into the reserve, where we take a guided walk to get closer to nature and hopefully track the endangered white rhino. After lunch we learn about the bushman paintings that adorn some of the rock overhangs. We visit the site of Cecil John Rhodes' grave and enjoy the magnificent sights from World's View.

We return to our camp in the late afternoon and enjoy a sundowner and evening around the campfire.

Includes: Entrance to Matobos National Park and game walks.
Distance/time: ±340km, 5h00 actual driving time. Rolling hills, a few roadblocks and a lunch stop should mean a travel day of ±6h30.
Overnight: Campsite – good ablution facilities, hot showers.



Day 13 -14 **HWANGE NATIONAL PARK** [camping BLD]

One of the most famous wildlife reserves in Southern Africa, Hwange National Park, the biggest game reserve in Zimbabwe, is our next stop. We camp on a wildlife concession bordering the park and spend the following full day in search of big game on an open vehicle game drive.

Proclaimed in 1928 this reserve forms an important conservation area along the Zimbabwe and Botswana Border. Photographic opportunities abound, as we search for the large herds of elephant, buffalo and plains game that inhabit the park. Great birdwatching with 420 species recorded in the park, and if we are lucky, we might spot some of the elusive predators. The waterholes also offer good opportunities as the wildlife comes down to drink. We stop for a rest and lunch at a picnic site in the park before enjoying the afternoons sightings. We head back to camp in the late afternoon for our final night around the campfire.

Day 13, 14: Breakfast provide by the tour leaders with the help of the group

Includes: Entrance fees, full day game drive in open 4WD game viewing vehicle.
Distance/time: ±335km, 5h00 actual driving time, with an early start and tarmac roads we aim to arrive for lunchtime with a total travel day of ±5h30. (Note: road works to repair heavily potholed sections and very rough detour gravel roads are adding +/-2hrs to the total travel time.)
Overnight: Campsite – good ablution facilities, hot showers & swimming pool.



Day 15 **VICTORIA FALLS – TOUR ENDS** [- B--]

On our final day we have a short transfer from our last camping site to Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe where the tour ends around lunchtime.

Distance/time: ±200km, 3h00 actual driving time, allowing for a short stop we have a total travel day of ±3h30.

Why travel with Sunway Safaris

We understand that there are several options available to you when choosing your African safari. We also know that you want to make the most informed decision about your safari, what you get, what's included and what you see and experience. - **Small groups** – by travelling with a maximum of 12 people, you can witness Africa and have first-hand contact with this amazing continent and its people without being a negative influence. This has been a key factor in our continued success. Our trips appeal to a wide demographic of traveller. Our clients range in age from 25 to 65+ with the average being 45. The range of travellers gives a variety of perspectives which adds to the experience of each safari.
- **2 Sunway tour guides** – group leaders are the key to any safari. On a Sunway safari you will travel with 2 qualified field guides (Field Guides Association of SA). Two guides as crew, not a guide and a driver, means interesting trips with maximum knowledge and information. On German departures one of the tour leaders may be a German-speaking translator alongside one qualified guide, so you still benefit from expert guidance while enjoying the tour in your preferred language. Our guides have a passion for Africa, her people and wildlife, and they love nothing more than sharing their knowledge with you.
- **Guaranteed departures** – departure dates on each itinerary shown as bold are guaranteed departure dates. All other departures operate with a minimum of 4 clients.
- **All-inclusive price** – when we travel ourselves, we always feel that if we're in a country we should find and see the best it has to offer. So when planning the Sunway routes, we ensure that each trip provides the best inclusions and experiences. For example, if you go to Botswana – you have to visit the national parks in an open 4WD – it is the essence of the Botswana wilderness. If you tour Zambia, then you must visit South Luangwa NP and do a game walk with a local scout. When booking on a Sunway Safari there are no hidden costs. All of the entrance fees are included, and a wide range of activities, and most meals. We have included many highlights in our tours, so that you will see and experience the highlights without having to pay extra when you get there. So when you decide on which safari company to book with, look

carefully at what you're actually getting. You may only visit a place once, make sure you get the most out of it.

- **Safety** – our fleet of vehicles are custom built to ensure comfortable and safe touring. Each is constructed, by an authorised passenger vehicle builder, to the latest safety requirements, with a safety shell, and every seat has a lap belt. This gives you peace of mind when travelling with Sunway Safaris on the often demanding African roads.

As such, our itineraries and routes have been perfected over many years ensuring that your tour will run smoothly. We visit the highlights of Southern Africa but ensure that you do not follow the well-trodden tourist track. All of us at Sunway Safaris have extensive travel experience in Africa, and throughout the world. Being adventure travellers ourselves, we know how to plan trips that give you a broad experience of the countries that you will visit.

- **Age Policy** - On all scheduled tours, we accept children 12-17 with accompanying adult. We have no upper age limit. Clients older than 65 years of age at the time of travel require a medical certificate stating the client is fit and healthy to join an adventure travel group tour. We have many clients over 65 years of age, who are perfectly capable of enjoying every aspect of a Sunway tour, both accommodated and camping. For more details contact marketing@sunway-safaris.com.

Accommodation

- **Camping – Camping** – where possible we will stay at designated campsites in national parks, on private land and in towns. Campsite facilities are generally very good but in places can be basic. There are hot and cold showers, restaurants, washing facilities and telephones available at most of the campsites. Some camps have simple reed enclosures for showers but do have flush toilets! On other nights in expedition trips we may be forced to stay wherever we can find a campsite, this could even be an unscheduled wild camping night. Sunway supplies all the camping equipment with the exception of your sleeping bag and pillow. The dome tents we use are 2.2 x 2.2 x 1.8 meters and putting them up or down takes only 5 minutes. Tents have built-in insect nets. We supply mattresses, which are about 5 cm thick, warm and comfortable. The camp chairs have a backrest. You will need to bring your own sleeping bag (and a small camp pillow) and a towel. Should you not have, or do not want to buy a sleeping bag, you can rent a sleeping bag and camp pillow from the Sunway office for Euro 1 per sleeping bag per day on tour. Please book this at the time of booking.

Local Payment

- A local payment is required on this safari and this will be collected by your tour leader on departure. The local payment forms part of your overall tour cost and must be taken into consideration when booking your safari. It will be used by your tour leaders to pay for some of the operational costs incurred on safari.

Sunway prepays by bank transfer, as many of the tour costs as possible. However, in many cases, a cash payment is the only option: certain of the destinations that we visit, only accept cash. For example entry fees to most national parks, some of the campsites and also local food markets (and even some shops) are only payable in cash. In addition, each Sunway vehicle has a garage card but these are only accepted in South Africa and parts of Namibia, therefore in all other countries, fuel must be paid for in cash. Due to the remoteness of some departure points, having a local payment system enables us to manage tour funds effectively. The efficiency of this system helps keep the overall tour prices down.

For these reasons, it is necessary for Sunway to charge a local payment. It also ensures that a portion of the tour costs goes directly into the country you are visiting, thereby benefiting local communities and contributing to the conservation of the areas we visit. This is all part of Sunway Safaris' ongoing effort to operate sustainable safaris that make a real difference.

It is important that you ensure that your USD notes are clean and undamaged, as many banks and exchange bureaus will not accept dirty, damaged or torn notes. Pre-2013 issue US\$ notes are not accepted in some places, so Sunway will not accept these notes as local payment.

Food

- We pride ourselves on offering delicious healthy meals to our clients and will provide three meals per day, except where shown in the itinerary, when we try out local restaurants.
- The tour leaders do the shopping and meal planning for each group. He/she will always try to obtain fresh produce wherever possible. A rough idea of what these will consist of is: Breakfast - cereals or coffee and toast or the occasional fried breakfast, Lunch - cheese, cold meats, salads on bread or rolls, Dinner - braais (local barbecue), potjies (stews), stir-fries etc. We use regular plates, cups and cutlery. All cooking and eating utensils will also be provided.
- Please be aware that, due to the diverse tastes of our clients, we are unable to accommodate individual food preferences on our group tours. The group shared meals we provide are subject to available produce, and in our sometimes-remote destinations, the variety of ingredients is sometimes limited. However, we do take allergies, vegetarian and vegan dietary requirements into consideration to ensure everyone has suitable meal options.
- We will supply fruit squash served with breakfast and tea or coffee served with breakfast and dinner. All other beverages will be for your own expense. We will not supply bottled drinking water although it is available at many shops on tour.

Difficulty

- Anyone who is generally active and in good health should enjoy this trip. Simple campsites and basic wild camps are enjoyed by the outdoor enthusiast, you will get dusty on occasion; but this is Africa!
- Full itinerary with a couple of long driving days. The road conditions through the wilderness areas are very poor and our progress can at times be slow and dusty. Remember to hold on at all times and enjoy the ride!
- Everyone is asked to help with the running of camp on tour. In other words, if everyone spends a little time setting up camp, preparing meals and cleaning up then the tour will run smoothly and everyone will have a good time. Participation is the name of the game.

Things you should know

- Includes park entrances and game drives.
- As this tour spends most a large amount of time in wildlife areas it is essential that clients adhere to the tour leaders (and local guides) instructions regarding interaction with wildlife, camp safety and game walk/drive rules.
- You will need a valid passport and visas for entry into Zambia and Zimbabwe.
- You are joining an Under Canvas camping trip; you will need to bring your own sleeping bag (and small camp pillow) and a towel. Should you not have, or do not want to buy a sleeping bag, you can rent a sleeping bag and camp pillow from the Sunway office for Euro 1 per sleeping bag per day on tour. Please book this at the time of booking.
- Luggage, please pack to a limit of 12kgs in a soft sports tog bag. Also, bring a daypack for walks and keeping in the vehicle.
- For the Okavango Delta wilderness camp, you need to re-pack clothes and personal items for the two nights into your daypack, as space on the mekoro is limited. Your main bag will remain in Maun.
- We recommend that you bring a small amount of Euro or US\$ for personal expenses on this trip. In Zimbabwe you will need USD cash (or EUR or ZAR although they are less readily accepted). In Zambia in some cases you'll be able to pay local service providers in forex, and in some cases you'll need to change into the local currency (Zambian Kwacha). Zambia requires that all services are paid in local currency. Mastercard and Visa credit cards can also be used for restaurants, shops and optional activities throughout the tour. See the Sunway tour dossier for approximate costs of drinks and meals etc.

Common questions about this trip

1. **Is it safe?** Zimbabwe has been involved in a political power struggle over the past few years, and this has deterred tourists from travelling to the country. Having said this, the Zimbabwe people are always friendly and helpful to visitors to their country and tourists are welcomed with open arms. In the wild areas, your guide will brief you on the necessary precautions, follow this advice and you will be fine. Be aware of your personal belongings and you will have a great trip!
2. **Do I need malaria tablets?** Yes, the trip passes through malaria areas and prophylactics are recommended.
3. **What do I need to bring?** All details are covered in our general tour briefing (available from www.sunway-safaris.com on the home page) but the basics are: - comfortable clothes for warm days and cool evenings, walking shoes, flashlight, a raincoat, hat and sunglasses, swimsuit, a small pair of binoculars also comes in very handy and most importantly - a sense of adventure!
